What is UNFOLD?

UNFOLD is a camp style group that provides support to siblings of children with special needs. Children can learn how other kids and families have thought of creative ways to handle sometimes tricky situations, and have a lot of fun while doing it! There will be recreational activities, games, whole group and small group times, lunch, and a chance to unfold. When it comes down to it, brothers and sisters have a lot to offer one another. Information and discussions will be mixed with games and creative expressions throughout the time at camp. Campers will be invited to share their perspectives on the challenges and joys of having siblings with special needs with other children.

How to register for UNFOLD?

Fill out both a registration form and information form, sign the release, and send payment to Pediatric Development Center. Checks should be made payable to PDC.

What ages is UNFOLD for?

Currently UNFOLD is open to children in 2nd through 5th grades.

How many children per group?

Spaces are limited. UNFOLD will accept a maximum of 12 campers per session. Registration will be handled on a first come, first serve basis.

Are scholarships available?

A limited number of scholarships are available. If you would like a scholarship for your child, please indicate so on the registration form.

Who runs UNFOLD?
